The tenderers/bidders are required to submit soft copies of their bids electronically on the CPP Portal, using valid Digital Signature Certificates (DSC). The instructions given below are meant to assist the tenderers/bidders in registering on the CPP Portal, prepare their bids in accordance with the requirements and submitting their bids online on the CPP Portal. REGISTRATION

1) Tenderers/bidders are required to enroll on the e-Procurement module of the Central Public Procurement Portal (URL: <u>https://eprocure.gov.in/eprocure/app</u>) by clicking on the link "**Click here to Enroll**" on the CPP Portal. Enrolment is free of Charge.

As part of the enrolment process, the tenderers/bidders will be required to choose a unique username and assign a password for their accounts.

Tenderers/bidders are advised to register their valid email address and mobile numbers as part of the registration process. These would be used for any communication from the CPP Portal.

Upon enrolment, the tenderers/bidders will be required to register their valid Digital Signature Certificate (Class II or Class III Certificates with signing key usage) issued by any Certifying Authority recognized by CCA India (e.g. Sify / TCS / nCode / eMudhra etc.), with their profile.

Only one valid DSC should be registered by a tenderer/bidders. Please note that the tenderers/bidders are responsible to ensure that they do not lend their DSC's to others which may lead to misuse.

Bidder then logs in to the site through the secured log-in by entering their user ID & password and the password of the DSC / e-Token.

SEARCHING FOR TENDER DOCUMENTS

- (a) There are various search options built in the CPP Portal, to facilitate tenderers/bidders to search active tenders by several parameters. These parameters could include organization name, location, date, value, etc. There is also an option of 'Advanced Search' for tenders, wherein the tenderers/bidders may combine a number of search parameters such as organization name, form of contract, location, date, other keywords etc. to search for a tender published on the CPP Portal.
- (b) Once the tenderers/bidders have selected the tenders they are interested in, they may download the required documents / tender schedules. These tenders can be moved to the respective "My Tenders" folder. This would enable the CPP Portal to intimate the tenderers/bidders through SMS / e-mail in case there is any corrigendum issued to the tender document.
- (c) The bidder should make a note of the unique Tender ID assigned to each tender, in case they want to obtain any clarification / help from the Helpdesk.

PREPARATION OF BIDS

- (a) Tenderer/bidder should take into account any corrigendum published on the tender document before submitting their bids. Please go through the tender advertisement and the tender document carefully to understand the documents required to be submitted as part of the bid. Please note the number of covers in which the bid documents have to be submitted, the number of documents - including the names and contents of each of the documents that need to be submitted.
- (b) Bidder, in advance, should get ready the bid documents to be submitted as indicated in the tender document / schedule and generally they can be in PDF / XLS / RAR / DWF formats

as mentioned. Bid documents may be scanned with 100 dpi with black and white option.

(c) To avoid the time and efforts required in uploading the same set of standard documents which are required to be submitted as a part of every bid, a provision of uploading such standard documents (e.g. PAN card copy, annual reports, auditor certificates etc.) has been provided to the tenderers/bidders. Tenderers/bidders can use "My Space" area available to them to upload such documents. These documents may be directly submitted from the "My Space" area while submitting the bid just by tagging and need not be uploaded again and again. This will lead to a reduction in the time required for bid submission process.

SUBMISSION OF BIDS

- 1) Tenderer/bidder should log into the site well in advance for bid submission so that he/she up loads the Bid in time i.e. on or before the bid submission time as per the system. Bidder will be responsible for any delay due to other issues.
- 2) Tenderer/bidder has to digitally sign and upload the required bid documents one by one as indicated in the tender document.
- 3) The Tender Inviting Authority (TIA) will not be held responsible for any sort of delay or the difficulties faced during the submission of bids online by the tenderers/bidders. The bidder should see that the bid documents submitted should be free from virus and if the documents could not be opened, due to virus, during tender opening, the bid is liable to be rejected.
- 4) The tenderer should furnish EMD in requisite format as indicated in the NIT and upload scanned copy of the same along with technical bid of the tender. EMD to be submitted to the Centre physically before due date of the tender.
- 5) Tenderers/bidders are requested to note that they should necessarily submit their financial bids in the format provided and no other format is acceptable. The price bid has been given as a standard Rate Quote Sheet (Percentage BoQ Template) in .xls format with the tender document, which is to be downloaded and to be filled by all the tenderers/bidders. Tenderers/bidders are required to download the Rate Quote Sheet (Percentage BoQ Template) file, open it and complete the blue colored (unprotected) cells with their respective financial quotes and other details (such as name of the Tenderer/bidder). No other cells should be changed. Once the details have been completed, the tenderer/bidder should save it and submit it online, without changing the filename. If the Rate Quote Sheet (Percentage BoQ Template) file is found to be modified by the tenderer/bidder, the bid will be rejected. In e-Tendering, intending tenderer/bidder can quote their rate in figures only. The total amount is generated automatically. Therefore, the rate quoted by the tenderer/bidder in figures shall be taken as correct. The Comparative Statement is also generated automatically by the system. 1). Introduction

National Science centre Delhi is a unit of National Council of Science Museums functioning under the Ministry of Culture, Government of India. It is bestowed with the responsibility of developing certain facilities at Kedarnath Dham. The present work of Kedar Parichay Museum in Kedarnath is one of them. A building is constructed (nearing finishing) having three floors with around 4000 sq. ft. area (excluding circulation and staircase areas) dedicated to the museum in the vicinity of the Kedarnath temple.

The museum is located in high altitudes where movement of materials poses a challenge. This museum will remain closed for around 6 months (from November till March/April) due to heavy snowfall. The visitors to this museum will be primarily pilgrims. All these aspects need to be kept in view while deciding the displays, technologies, accessibility etc. in the museum.

This museum concept is decided by National Museum Institute (being the knowledge partner for the project) which is attached with this document. The detailed curation and content development needs to be done in line with the concept proposed to be propagated in the museum. Any clarity or detailing may be done in consultation and close interaction with NMI

It is proposed to tell the story of Kedarnath – its historicity, geology, geography, spiritualism, beliefs and practices, its sanctity, its features and different aspects of Shiva – through various modes of presentations including display of objects/replicas, audio visual presentations, digital interactives etc. in an engaging manner considering the site conditions.

2). Gallery Spaces & Object Details

The total space available for museum in the building is 4,000 sq. ft. which is divided into 3 floors. The floor drawings and dimensions are attached herewith in this tender. Details of objects/replicas, if suggested by knowledge partner are to be used, the same required to be considered accordingly.

- 3. <u>Detailed Scope of Work</u> Please refer to the <u>Annexure A2</u> that gives the overarching details of the project and a curatorial note prepared for this project keeping in view the requirement of project. The agency is required to study this and prepare the detailed plan, as narrated below, to implement this concept and the requirements in the museum:
 - a) Developing a Concept Plan: This plan will be based on a single holistic theme after taking into consideration of the available space, number & types of objects available display and objects that can be created specific to the exhibition and their context & importance in the overall theme for creating a seamless narrative which shall be applicable for exhibits displayed in different floors. Complete list of objects, if available, will be made available to successful bidder. The concept plan should also incorporate aspects for making the overall presentation more aesthetic, meaningful, informative and interactive to enrich visitor's experience.

- **b)** Creation of Sub themes: Under the aegis of the overall concept plan, exhibits in different floors will be created based on physical space separation, timeline, availability and contextualization of objects etc. The successful bidder or the agency shall provide the Concept Plan along with sub themes, space planning, list of objects for display, proposed digital interventions etc. (*Milestone 1*)
- c) Content and Storyline Development: Based upon sub themes & object selection the successful bidder shall prepare narratives on the contents for each space. This is to be submitted in the form of a complete document detailing the content, story line, narratives etc., for approval. (*Milestone 2*)
- **d)** Gallery Design: This will include gallery layout, design/re-design of showcases/display cases/pedestals etc., placement of showcases, placement of objects, making provisions of placement and maintenance of digital equipment, interactive kiosks, AV displays etc. and include the following:
 - Display design shall also take into account sensitivity of antiquities like temperature, humidity, security, illumination level etc. The design shall also include formulation of appropriate content and the narratives (Wall text, Object Label, Group Label, Graphics Panel etc.) supporting all exhibits within all galleries, visitor flow patterns with preferred unidirectional entry- exit system.
 - The gallery design shall represent the overall concept, the broad theme and sub themes.
 - Design shall also include provision for deployment of digital technology for engaging experiences which could be interactive, immersive, experiencing interpretation, multi-touch screen display, seamless video walls, AR/VR/MR applications, large screen immersive projections, 4K video displays, smart multilingual audio guides through smart phones along with content management system. It may be noted that digital interventions shall primarily be considered to supplement the museum objects and should not be overdone. The museum's antiquities should remain the primary source of attraction for the visitors. The content management system and the audio guide should have the scope of future expansion.
 - The lighting to be carefully planned so that electrical load of exhibition is within reasonable limits and suits the concept of the museum.
 - Any other item necessary for Museum set-up and visitor's interpretation and facilitation.
- e) Drawings & Bill of Quantities: The agency (successful bidder) shall provide detailed & ready for construction drawings in both AutoCAD and pdf format along with bill of quantities with estimated cost with clear technical specifications of all materials/equipment including all digital interfaces. While deciding the cost/rates of components, the costs involved in transporting them to the high altitude through existing and available means need to be kept in mind to arrive at workable rates. All raw materials, fittings, fixtures, equipment, gadgets etc. shall be of acceptable and reputed brands that can withstand the temperature conditions of site with proper warranty terms for execution through a separate tender.

The Agency shall submit 3-D layout and walkthrough model for all the gallery spaces to depict the final presentation and proper visualization for final approval. The agency shall

make presentations (3-4 nos. minimum) of the concept and their designs for approval at different levels as per the details communicated to them and on-board the suggestions received by expert committees/ministry/NMI in consultation with National Science Centre, Delhi to incorporate in their designs.

The agency shall provide ready for print high resolution images/visuals of the graphics, texts, labels of all levels (exhibit, group, theme, floor etc.) which are proposed and approved. Separate bill of quantities shall be submitted for the selected objects/replicas etc. for their sourcing, movement and installation which shall be implemented by the agency who will be engaged to execute the project based on the DPR. However, the Agency shall provide guidelines, if any, for handling these artwork/objects and artefacts for dismantling, temporary storage and reinstallation. The Agency shall also provide a detailed timeline for execution of the project. (*Milestone 3*)

f) Curatorial walk & Content for Audio Guide App: The Agency (successful bidder) shall submit a plan for curatorial walk of about 25-30 minutes for guided visit of the gallery spaces. The agency shall also develop the entire content for a Mobile Audio Guide App covering all aspects of the museum and guide the identified vendor in APP development. (*Milestone 4*)

Apart from these essential components, the agency or successful bidder is free to add more optional components, if necessary, keeping the main objective in view. However, NSCD/NCSM reserves the right to modify the plan by adding, excluding or changing the content or mode of presentation of the proposed components at the time of implementation.

g) The agency shall guide the fabricators of the galleries when the fabrication actually starts. Dayto-day supervision is not under the scope of the agency but the overall guidance shall be required. The agency will have to visit site as per requirement communicated by NSCD/NCSM for which actual expenses shall be reimbursed for the personnel deployed. Final certification of the executed work to be provided by the agency. (*Milestone 5*)

The selected agency will be required to work in close consultation with NMI to develop the detailed curation and content preparation.

- 4. <u>Estimated Cost</u>: The Estimated cost of the work is around Rs. 20 (twenty) lakh excluding GST.
- 5. <u>Timeline</u>: Total completion duration for major activities of work is 75 days.

(Note: The work shall be completed within **45 days** (Milestones 1-3) from date of issue of Letter of Acceptance (LOA). **75 days** for milestone 4; and milestone 5 will ends with completion of the whole execution work at site. Timeline will be calculated from the award of the work.)

6. Eligibility Criteria

Bidders fulfilling the following minimum criteria shall only be considered:

Individual, Limited Company/Corporation, Proprietary Firm, Partnership, Consortium or Joint Venture is allowed to bid for the work. Company/Firm/Consortium/Partnership firm/Individual shall have the experience of academic, technical and financial capabilities on the lines mentioned below.

a) Experience - The bidder should have a minimum of 5 years' experience in executing

interpretation/ museum works, having handled projects related to Heritage and Culture at International/ National / State level and must have accomplished at least 3 Heritage/ Culture related interpretation projects. The bidders shall submit copies of <u>work orders and completion</u> <u>certificates</u> to substantiate the claim.

- b) The bidder should have past experience of designing and <u>curating three museum gallery spaces</u> of at least 4,000 sq. feet in the last five years. Certified copies of <u>completion certificate clearly</u> <u>indicating the area of gallery space curated shall be required</u> to substantiate the claim.
- c) Financial soundness The applicant should have:
 - i) PAN and GST registration
 - ii) Average Turnover of at least Rs. 100.00 lakh in last 3 years (in case of Consortium, Rs. 75.00 Lakh for lead partner and total of Rs. 100.00 lakh for the entire consortium)
 - iii) The Bidder should have completed the similar works during the last 5 years from the date of the issue of this tender as per the details given below.

One similar work of value not less than Rs. 16 lakh (or) Two similar works each of value not less than Rs. 12 lakh (or) Three similar works each of value not less than 8 lakh.

Notes:

- Here **similar work** shall mean conceptualization, planning, curation, content development, designing of gallery spaces and submission of detailed estimates & BoQ with technical specifications.
- In the case of Consortium/JV participating in this tender, the works of any of the individual members of the Consortium/JV done independently will be considered as valid work experience.
- If any bidder has executed the similar work as a part of a consortium/JV in the past then the work experience of the bidder shall be considered as valid only if all the consortium/JV partners are participating together in the present tender also.
- The details of qualifying works/projects shall be furnished as per the proforma in **Annexure-I** and if required, the bidder shall also facilitate inspection of the above qualifying project(s) by NSCD/NCSM's officials to ascertain the performance of the bidder.
- Documents Required: The bidder should submit a copy/copies of the work order(s) issued in the name of the agency as well as copies of work completion certificate of the same work, clearly indicating the value of the work of similar nature. If the work order contains several works, only the value of the works of a similar nature shall be considered for work experience. - **d)** Technical Expertise- The bidder should have associated/employed panel of expert(s) having following qualifications:

- ii) Graphic designer, technology experts (hardware & software) and content writer shall have past experience in doing similar nature of work.
- iii) The bidders shall be advised to present a Proof of Concept (PoC) at the stage of technical bid presentation.
